The Eminent Career Award

The Eminent Career Award is awarded to individuals who have influenced either the practice of, or the thinking (theorizing) about career development through leadership activities or scholarship. Their careers are characterized by frequent, periodic, and sustained activities over a substantial period of time. This award is considered NCDA's highest honor. And the award goes to...

Janet Lenz has authored or co-authored numerous publications including Career Development and Planning: A Comprehensive Approach, The Self-Directed Search & Related Holland Materials, the Career Thoughts Inventory, and Career Thoughts Inventory workbook. She is a Master Career Counselor and National Certified Counselor. She is Past-President of the National Career Development Association (NCDA) and an NCDA Fellow. Prior to her presidency she served as NCDA's Southern Region Trustee. In 2007, she received the American Counseling Association's Professional Development Award.

Each of the following areas are considered: years of service, quality of service, and participation and leadership in career development professional associations. NCDA has selected four recipients of the Outstanding Career Practitioner Award this year. And the awards go to...

Elisabeth Sanders-Park is the President of WorkNet Solutions. As an author, trainer, and consultant, Elisabeth is a nationally recognized careers expert with more than fifteen actively influencing employment and career development services for the difficult to place. In 2012, she authored the Workplace Excellence Series designed to help job seekers and incumbent workers cultivate and deliver the soft skills that employer want today.

Patrick Lennahan has more than 30 years' experience directing university career centers and as an independent consultant. He has been an Associate Editor of NCDA's web magazine Career Convergence's Post-Secondary department for fifteen years. A Master Career Counselor, Patrick was instrumental in re-establishing the Rhode Island Career Development Association five years ago.

Gemma Williams is a Professor and Counselor at Kapi'olani Community College in Hawaii. She is recognized by her colleagues for her leadership as the Coordinator of the Career Exploration, Transfer, and Graduations Services Center for over 12 years. The Merit Award

The NCDA Merit Award honors individuals who have made significant contributions to the field of career development including education and mentoring of career counseling students,



development of or leadership in exemplary career programs, conducting significant research in the field, and/or advocacy efforts to inform and persuade policy makers about career development. And the award goes to...

Elena Polenova, the Associate Director of Career Counseling and Education at Stony Brook University Career Center. Elena is known for her contributions to the career development field by integrating direct practice with education, programming, advocacy within the academy, and longitudinal research. Her research studying the impact of cultural and parental influences on students' career identity development has received much attention.

The International Practitioner of the Year Award

The NCDA International Practitioner of the Year Award recognizes one member who has made a significant contribution to the advancement of NCDA's mission in their respective country, as selected by the NCDA International Committee. And the award goes to...

Shelley Tien, a Professor of Educational Psychology and Counseling at National Taiwan Normal University, and President of the Taiwan Career Development Association and Past President of the Asia Pacific Career Development Association. Included in Shelley's achievements are the translation of the Career Development Facilitator curriculum into Chinese and the development of a localized CDF program in Taiwan.

Service to International Students Award

The NCDA Service to International Students Award is intended to recognize college/university career services offices and/or career centers that have made an active commitment to partnering with and supporting the career development of international students. And the award goes to...

The Career Center at University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign for their Career Certificate for International Students especially as international enrollment has increased to 17% of the undergraduate student body. The Career Certificate for International Students is an innovative approach proven to enhancing career self-efficacy, resume quality, job search skills in the US, and the students' ability to clearly and positively describe their experiences in an elevator pitch.



Exemplary Career Center Award

This award promotes the continued development and implementation of thoughtful and innovative initiatives that support career development for outstanding service within the education, government, and/or community setting. The award goes to...

Kelley School of Business Undergraduate Career Services at Indiana University, previous winner of the NCDA Service to International Students Award. Diversity Initiative Award

Cassandra Storlie, an Assistant Professor at Kent State University. The Career Development Facilitator Champion Award




